





#### SPLIT SCREEN NOTE TAKING OVERVIEW & TUTORIAL

Students who use Split Screen Note Taking locate, read, annotatie, organize, cite, and write about SPS book and database text that's relevant to a teacher's curriculum and the Common Core. The Split Screen technique uses ideas from the "Big 6" and Noodletools research models in a unique way that seems to work very well with our district's text and tech resources, and it's applicable to any subject area or grade level.

According to Robert Marzano, Debra Pickering, and Jane Policick, there are nine instructional strategies that are most likely to improve student achievement across all content areas and grade levels. "Summarizing and note taking" is number two on their list. Students who use the Split Screen Nute Taking research process are able to write notes about what they are studying in class, summarize their information, and at the same time learn relevant content-related material and valuable literacy, research, and technology skills.
